




However, I can't do that with avant-garde, because too many things are considered avant-garde: from expressionism to suprematism.






University of Glasgow, Glasgow, Scotland


ONE-DAY HIKE PSILODENTRO-MILOMERI WATERFALLS

The hike offered by American Academy is created with the privilege of giving the students the opportunity to earn the Duke of Edinburgh award.



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Effective Study Techniques & General Mental Health

On the 18th of October our Head Boy, Karim Thalji and Psychology Teacher, Elena Frixou gave us a presentation on Effective Study Techniques and a guide on maintaining good mental health throughout a student's academic experience, respectively. Here are some short introductions to their presentations.



Our psychology teacher Ms. Elena Frixou also gave a short presentation on the importance of mental health during student's academic experience and the impact it has on their lives, their performance in school and the overall wellbeing of their social, personal and family life. Ms. Elena stressed on the importance of balance in a pupil's life and also gave input on how the students can help their situation by talking to someone and expressing their emotions and thoughts. Ms. Elena also offered help to any students in need of it and let them know that her door is always open for anything that needs to be expressed and anyone who is in need.



After hearing about the constant concern of students not knowing how to learn effectively, our Head Boy decided to step in to help. Having been in the same situation before when taking the IGCSE syllabus, Karim researched extensively and found learning methods that were the cornerstone of his academic excellence. Karim's presentation mainly revolved around techniques called known as "active recall" and "spaced repetition". Active recall is about retrieving information from memory by testing oneself at each stage of the learning process, whereas repetition involves repeating one or more topics at increasing intervals until the knowledge is fully embedded in long-term memory. Our Head Boy showed them how to use these techniques specifically, such as creating lists of questions for each chapter, using flashcards, teaching the topic to someone or to themselves by reciting the information aloud, and more.



28th October “OXI Day” Parade

The 28th of October is an important day for Greeks and Cypriots alike, it commemorates the famous “OXI” or “NO” told by Greek Prime Minister Ioannis Metaxas when asked by Benito Mussolini to either occupy certain locations of Greece or face war with Italy and Albania, the ensuing “NO” from the Greek Prime Minister was the start of the famous Greco-Italian war and eventually resulted with a Greek Victory and even though Greece eventually fell to the stronger Axis Powerhouse, Nazi Germany, “OXI” day is celebrated by all Greeks and Cypriots. For the bravery shown by Greek fighters and to commemorate their lives, most of whom were lost in defense of their ancestral, historical homeland.


